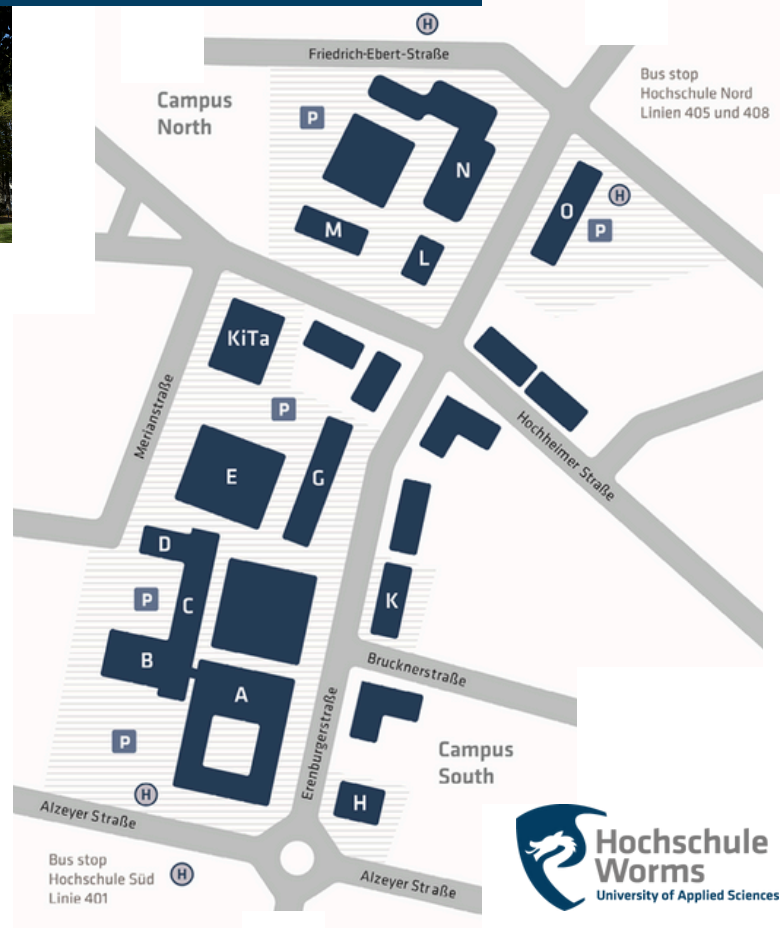
- Faculties: Computer Science, Business Management, Tourism & Travel Management

Accommodation

The International Center assists students in finding an accommodation in Worms for their exchange. We act as an intermediary between students and landlords. Currently, we can mostly offer accommodation in shared flats, but also apartments in dormitories. Rooms are furnished and located close to the campus.

Orientation Weeks

The orientation program enables students to integrate rapidly into the campus and social life in Worms. Participation in this event is a mandatory first step in their studies. We also offer a 3-day excursion to Berlin.



Visa & Residence Permit

Depending on the citizenship, students might need a visa to study in Germany. Students should inform themselves in time about the exact requirements at a German embassy or consulate, as it is a time-consuming process. Students with a valid passport from Australia, Israel, Japan, Canada, New Zealand, South Korea or the USA, can enter Germany without a visa and apply for a residence permit at the foreigners' office in Worms.
