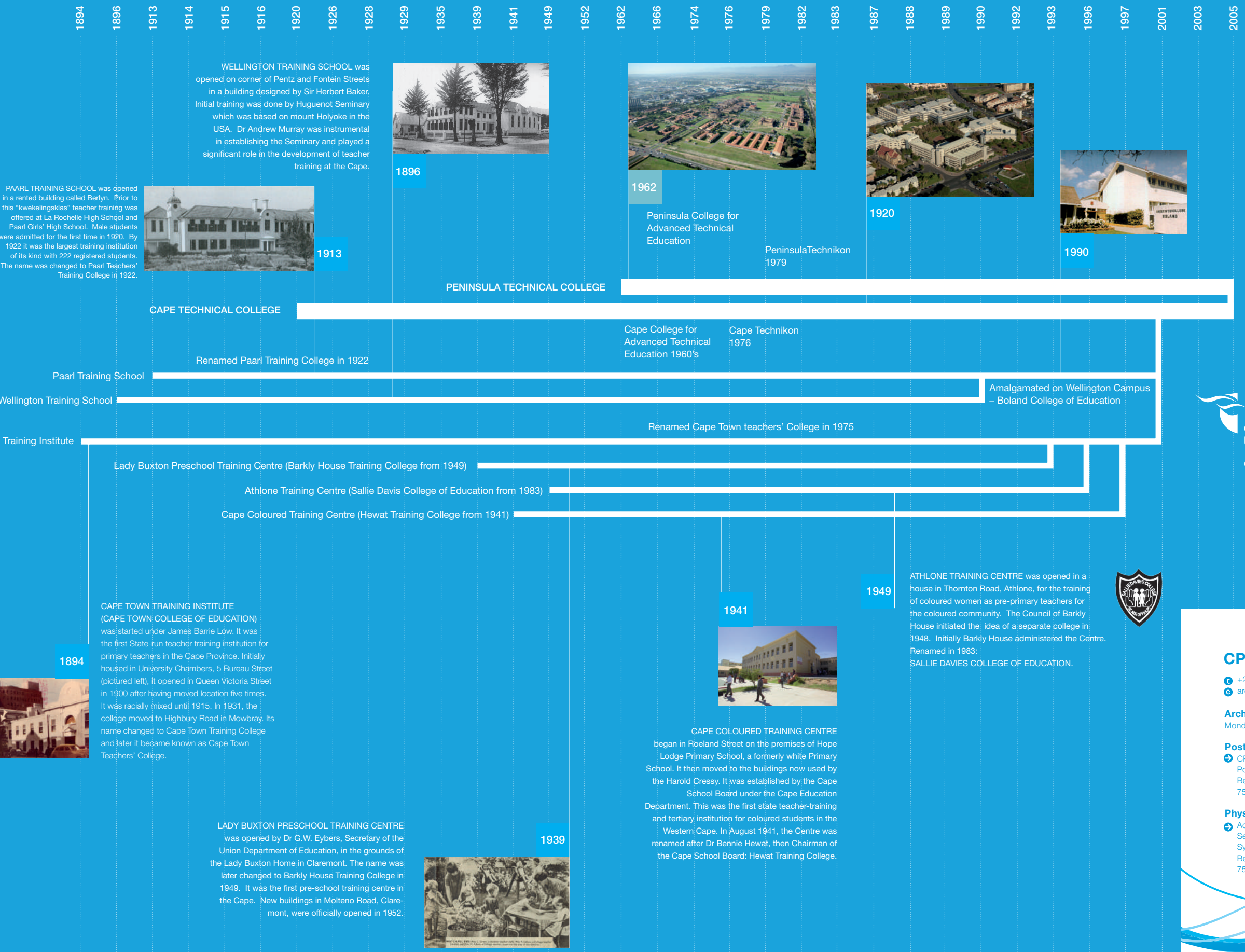

CAPE TOWN TRAINING INSTITUTE (CAPE TOWN COLLEGE OF EDUCATION) was started under James Barrie Low. It was the first State-run teacher training institution for primary teachers in the Cape Province. Initially housed in University Chambers, 5 Bureau Street (pictured left), it opened in Queen Victoria Street in 1900 after having moved location five times. It was racially mixed until 1915. In 1931, the college moved to Highbury Road in Mowbray. Its name changed to Cape Town Training College and later it became known as Cape Town Teachers' College.

WELLINGTON TRAINING SCHOOL was opened on corner of Pentz and Fontein Streets in a building designed by Sir Herbert Baker. Initial training was done by Huguenot Seminary which was based on mount Holyoke in the USA. Dr Andrew Murray was instrumental in establishing the Seminary and played a significant role in the development of teacher training at the Cape.

PAARL TRAINING SCHOOL was opened in a rented building called Berlyn. Prior to this "kwekelingsklas" teacher training was offered at La Rochelle High School and Paarl Girls' High School. Male students were admitted for the first time in 1920. By 1922 it was the largest training institution of its kind with 222 registered students. The name was changed to Paarl Teachers' Training College in 1922.

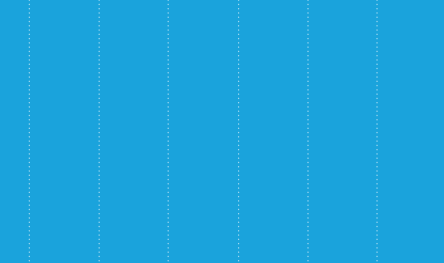

ATHLONE TRAINING CENTRE was opened in a house in Thornton Road, Athlone, for the training of coloured women as pre-primary teachers for the coloured community. The Council of Barkly House initiated the idea of a separate college in 1948. Initially Barkly House administered the Centre. Renamed in 1983: **SALLIE DAVIES COLLEGE OF EDUCATION.**

1941
CAPE COLOURED TRAINING CENTRE began in Roeland Street on the premises of Hope Lodge Primary School, a formerly white Primary School. It then moved to the buildings now used by the Harold Cressy. It was established by the Cape School Board under the Cape Education Department. This was the first state teacher-training and tertiary institution for coloured students in the Western Cape. In August 1941, the Centre was renamed after Dr Bennie Hewat, then Chairman of the Cape School Board: **Hewat Training College.**

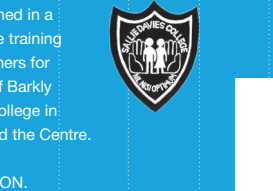

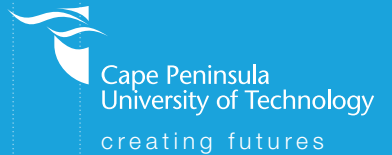

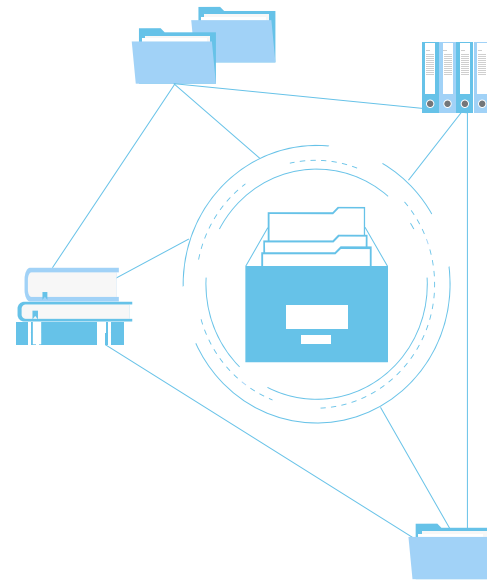

ARCHIVES ARE COLLECTIONS OF INFORMATION, KNOWN AS **RECORDS**.

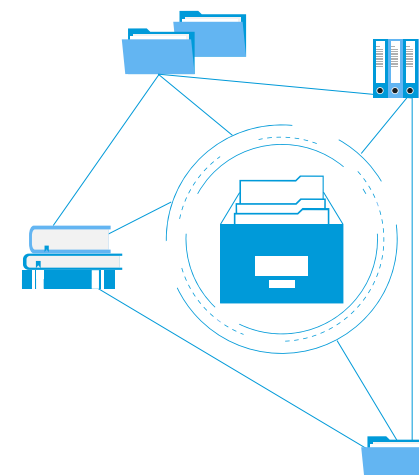
These come in many forms:

The archives promote knowledge and understanding of the origins, aims, programmes and goals of the university. It provides information services that will assist the operation of the university while serving research and scholarship through available collections.

It also encourages the University and community at large to use these collections. The archives serve as a resource to stimulate and nourish creative teaching and learning. Archival materials are consulted in the CPUT Archives Reading Room.
